Who:

Children who are three years of age by Jan. 1st, 2024 are eligible to participate in Early Childhood Screening.

<u>Please Note: Minnesota Statute requires that all children</u> <u>must be screened one time prior to entering kindergarten.</u>

What:

Screening is a free, quick, simple check of a child's overall development. The goal is to detect any possible learning or health concerns so that children can get the necessary help they need prior to entering kindergarten.

Help Me Grow Minnesota (helpmegrowmn.org) is a system for providing information to parents and caregivers about how a child develops and learns from birth to age 5. The website also provides a means for referring a child whom you may have concerns about. Help Me Grow connects children and families with early intervention professionals (teachers, therapists, etc.) in the child's local school district. Referrals are as easy as 1, 2, 3.

Setting up or Updating Your Account Profile

Eleyo is the convenient, mobile-friendly, online tool to register and manage your child's registration at the Aitkin Children's Center or for Community Education classes. Below are steps for creating your family account profile in anticipation of upcoming registration:

Create your Account Profile

- 1. Browse to the website: https://isdl.ce.eleyo.com
- 2. Create your profile by selecting Sign In (top, right corner).
- 3.To create a new profile, log in with Facebook or Google

select Create One Now.



- 1. When creating an account within the system, you will be required to enter your basic contact information including an email address (used for logging in) and a password. If your email address is recognized, use the Send Forgot Password Email to receive a password set email.
- 2. Select Manage All Relationships to add family members and emergency contacts.

An email will be sent from **Eleyo** with a link to verify your account. Use the Verify Your Email Address button on that email to verify your account.
